JONATHAN TRAILS...



A Walk a Day Keeps the Doctor Away...

With so many fitness trends buzzing around these days it's easy to get caught up in the hottest or newest exercise trends. Many of us forget that we already participate in one of the easiest and safest exercise programs every single day. I'm talking about going for a good old fashioned walk.

Walking provides a myriad of health benefits such as:

Decreasing blood pressure
Improving blood lipid profile
Lowering the risk of obesity
Reducing the risk of coronary
heart disease and some cancers
Enhancing mental well being
Reducing the risk of osteoporosis
Reducing the risk type 2 diabetes



It's easy to see why walking is the most popular form of physical activity for adults in the US, but are you getting enough? The American Heart Association recommends walking for at least 30 minutes a day, 5 days a week for a total of 150 minutes of moderate physical activity per week. You will even experience health benefits if sessions are broken in to shorter 10 or 15 minute segments. Another great way to track your daily physical activity is to wear a pedometer and shoot for around 10,000 steps each day.

Letter From Your Neighbor...

I have volunteered to help with the newsletter and thought to make it more personal with storiesyour stories.

I will begin with my story- true one. This last November 22, my husband Leo and I took our grand-daughter Abby out for a special night for her birthday! When we returned around 11:30 pm- the 1st red flag appeared. Our overhead garage door was open (we always keep it closed when we are gone). As Abby and I entered the house, the 2nd red flag appeared-my 5'x7' red carpet in the entry way was gone. We still had no idea yet what had happened.

As we entered the house, it was aware to us that we were victims of a burglary. My husband immediately grabbed his phone and called the police. Our Chaska police, detective, and crime lab did a thorough job till 2:30 in the morning. Early the next day, they questioned the surrounding neighbors for any info they might have. All had their doors shut and blinds pulled and never saw a thing.

From this episode, something good has come out of it. Half of my neighbors have agreed we need to be more of a community and watch out for each other. Some have put in alarms, others have put up motion lights but most of all, and we are more alert to each other's property.
