POLICY RESOLUTION # 13 – Jonathan Association Board of Directors

DATE: December 13, 2011

RE: Eitel House Eminent Domain Proposal

In addition to acknowledging that:

- The Eitel House, originally built of Chaska brick in 1875, is privately owned by Jonathan and the City of Chaska Heritage Preservation Commission considers the Eitel House to be a historic building; and,
- 2. The Eitel House has been vacant and unused since the early 2000's when it was discovered to have safety concerns due to high levels of radon gas; and,

While reaffirming that:

- 3. The Eitel House, in its current condition, does not promote the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of Jonathan; and,
- 4. The City of Chaska's Heritage Preservation Commission (MN Statute 138.71-138.75; MN Statute 471.193) and Chaska City Staff ("Powers & Duties" of the Heritage Preservation Commission, as outlined in Section 30:13 of Chapter 10.5 of the Code of Ordinances) has the authority to make recommendation that the Eitel House be acquired by the City via eminent domain powers; and,
- 5. The acquisition of the Eitel House by the City of Chaska via it's eminent domain authority would guarantee the "active pursuit of the best future for the building" (Melissa Duchinsky, 2006); and,
- 6. Jonathan's efforts to renovate or restore the Eitel House would not "make effective use of available financial resources", would not be "sound resource management", and would not be "fiscally responsible" (Jonathan Board of Directors Mission Statement, 2001); and,
- 7. The cost of restoring the Eitel House is an expense the Jonathan Association cannot afford since "...the Association is not in a financial position to maintain the Eitel House...and cannot afford to do so." (Debbie Boe, Jonathan Board member, June 2007);

The Jonathan Association Board of Directors resolves on this day (12-13-2011) to request the City of
Chaska to acquire the Eitel House from the Jonathan Association via the eminent domain process.
